Observation is referred to in several places in the revised Early Years Foundation Stage. Put simply observation is the practice of looking at and listening to children to find out how they are developing, what they like doing and what they are learning through their play and the experiences on offer.

Observation and assessment also help to improve the effectiveness of environments and programs.The right assessment methods, whether formal or informal, written or verbal, provide valid, reliable, accurate and helpful information regarding programs, curricula, environment, children, youth, and staff.A collaborative approach in observation and assessment improves communication with stakeholders (parents, specialists, staff, etc.).

Observational assessment uses Show me an Example Direct Practice of an Action - With the physical demonstration of the desired task, the candidate is immediately immersed in the actual work helping them to understand the employer's requirements. Authentic assessment includes tasks or observations that occur in the context of regular play or activities, in settings typical to the child. Each assessment method, whether an observational tool or a test, may incorporate features of authenticity (such as the use of feedback).

Early Childhood Assessment: 9 Keys of Effective Practice

• Role and skills of the practice educator / assessor are pivotal. • Direct observation is most effective (in terms of assessment AND supporting learning) when it is experienced as developmental and constructive. • Including meaningful and critical reflective dialogue improves outcomes. Benefits of Observation Observing a leader during their everyday activities reveals a variety of situations, stressors and behaviors. The observer can see leadership style, interactions with people, and detect skills that need practice and polish. In addition, observation can identify leader strengths and expertise that are unique.

Using an Observation & Feedback Model for Leadership ...

Consider that there are multiple effective approaches to teaching, and think of the observation as an opportunity to learn from your colleague. Work with the teacher to decide on the focus of the observation. When the instructor has agency, she will be more open to feedback and more likely to try out the strategies you suggest.
