Starred Review In 1989 sf writer Bruce Sterling coined the term slipstream to denote a kind of story that was neither sf nor fantasy, exactly, but that was showing up in all the places that sf and fantasy did; a kind of story that used sf and fantasy elements within otherwise realistic, or at least consistent, settings to provoke a feeling of strangeness or, better, feeling at home, strangely. The purpose of 'Feeling Very Strange' is to highlight and explore a sub-genreish pseudo-category of fiction coined 'slipstream' by Bruce Sterling in 1989. He defined it as "... a kind of writing which simply makes you feel very strange; the way that living in the late twentieth century makes you feel, if you are a person with a certain sensibility."

As editors James Patrick Kelly and John Kessel admit in the opening line of the introduction to their 2006 anthology Feeling Very Strange, the term 'slipstream' may be the most subjective in genre. Working with Bruce Sterling's initial stab at a definition, as well as some of their own ideas, the pair do, however, come up with a comprehensible set of parameters that may corral the term into a semi-manageable space.
