Be honest about your teaching style and try to use examples of what a typical teaching day is like for you. Outline methods you have used in the past that produced positive progress in your students. Example: "My teaching style is highly interactive.

Why It Works: This answer provides specifics about how the teacher sees their role. It also shows that the candidate is receptive to feedback and able to incorporate that into their approach. This is a good answer to give if there's time to elaborate. If you sense that the interviewer wants to move on, don't provide more detail.

How to Answer "What Is Your Teaching Philosophy?"

Don't think this is an easy question to answer! It isn't. You need to demonstrate during your answer you have the tenacity, enthusiasm, determination and mindset to become a teacher. Make sure you look at the job description and mention key elements of the role within your answer.

Ideally, you would read the school's behaviour policy before you go to interview and tailor your answers for that school. For example, they might be very anti 'shouting' which is a common tactic in schools, therefore you could appeal to this by explaining how you feel this is a negative strategy as it puts you in competition with the students as they try and compensate for your loudness.

How to answer eight difficult education interview questions

Interviewers will sometimes start an interview with an open-ended question like, "Tell me about yourself." This question is a way to break the ice and make you feel more comfortable during the interview process. However, some people might find this—and other interview questions about you—slightly stressful.

How to Answer "Tell Me About Yourself?" in an Interview

Cooperative learning often results in higher learning and better retention than other methods. Interviewers might ask this question to see your approach to learning and if it coincides with the goals of the school.
